FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT REQUEST

This Freedom of Information Act request is submitted on behalf of the Center for Biological Diversity ("the Center") and Greenpeace. (collectively "Requesters"). The Center is a non-profit, public interest, conservation organization whose mission is to conserve imperiled native species and their threatened habitat and to fulfill the continuing educational goals of its membership and the general public in the process. Greenpeace is an independent, non-profit campaigning organization that uses peaceful protest and creative communication to expose environmental problems and to promote solutions that are essential to a green and peaceful future. Greenpeace has offices in 42 countries around the world, and more than 20 offices in the US. Greenpeace works to educate and inspire its members and the general public to become involved on a wide variety of environmental issues, including climate change and biodiversity. Consistent with these missions, and consistent with the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552, the Requesters respectfully submit this request for records.

Requesters request copies of all memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, electronic mail records, or other documents that have been generated, received, kept and/or considered by the Minerals Management Service, now called the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation, and Enforcement (BOEMRE), related to environmental or safety issues pertaining to the BP Liberty drill rig including, but not limited to, any documents related to BP's November 2010 decision to delay construction of the Liberty drill rig.

Requesters further request copies of all memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, electronic mail records, or other documents that have been generated, received, kept and/or considered by BOEMRE that are responsive to Requesters' August 8, 2010 FOIA request (MMS 2010-00384)¹ and have been generated since the filing of that FOIA request.

In the event that access to any of the requested records is denied, please note that FOIA provides that any "reasonably segregable portion of a record shall be provided to any person requesting such record after deletion of the portions which are exempt under [FOIA]." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b). Please provide all non-exempt portions of the requested records that are reasonably segregable, describe the deleted material in detail, and specify the statutory basis for the denial, as well as your reasons for believing that the alleged statutory justification applies in each instance. Please separately state your reasons for not invoking your discretionary power to release the requested documents in the public interest.

This request is being sent to BOEMRE's Alaska OCS regional office and the BOEMRE headquarters with the understanding that it will be forwarded to any and all other offices that contain the requested documents.

REQUEST FOR FEE-WAIVER

The Requesters request that you waive all fees in connection with this matter. As shown below, the Requesters meet the two-pronged test under FOIA for a fee-waiver, 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii), as implemented by the Department of Interior's fee-waiver regulations at 43 C.F.R. § 2.19. *See also Judicial Watch v. Rossotti*, 326 F.3d 1309 (D.C. Cir. 2003).

In considering whether the Requesters meet the fee-waiver criteria, it is imperative that BOEMRE remember that FOIA carries a presumption of disclosure and was designed specifically to allow non-profit, public interest groups such as the Requesters access to government documents without the payment of fees. As stated by one Senator, "[A]gencies should not be allowed to use fees as an offensive weapon against requesters seeking access to Government information . . ." 132 Cong. Rec. S. 14298 (statement of Sen. Leahy). In interpreting this amendment, the Ninth Circuit has stated that the amended statute "is to be liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requesters." *McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (citing Sen. Leahy). The Ninth Circuit has also explicitly pointed out that the amendment's main purpose was "to remove

the roadblocks and technicalities which have been used by various Federal agencies to deny waivers or reductions of fees under the FOIA." *Id.*

Thus, both Congress and the courts are clear in their interpretation that the main legislative purpose of the amendments is to facilitate access to agency records by "watchdog" organizations, such as environmental groups, which use FOIA to monitor and challenge government activities. As a District of Columbia Circuit Court has stated, this waiver provision was added to FOIA "in an attempt to prevent government agencies from using high fees to discourage certain types of requesters and requests," in clear reference to requests from journalists, scholars, and, most importantly for our purposes, non-profit public interest groups. *Better Gov't Ass'n v. Department of State*, 780 F.2d 86, 93-94 (D.C. Cir. 1986), quoting *Ettlinger v. FBI*, 596 F. Supp. 867, 876 (D. Mass. 1984) (emphasis added).

I. <u>Disclosure of this information is in the public interest because it will significantly contribute to public understanding of the operations or activities of government.</u>

This requested information will significantly contribute to public understanding of the issues involved, as defined by the Department of Interior.

A. The subject of the request concerns "the operations and activities of the government."

The subject matter of this request relates to management of offshore oil and gas resources as well as the implementation of oil and gas and environmental laws and regulations, such as the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act, the Oil Pollution Act of 1990, the National Environmental Policy Act, the Endangered Species Act, and the Marine Mammal Protection Act, among others. It is clear that management of offshore oil and gas resources, as well as implementation and execution of environmental laws, are specific and identifiable activities of the government, in this case the executive branch agency, BOEMRE. *See Judicial Watch*, 326 F.3d at 1313 ("'[R]easonable specificity' is 'all that FOIA requires' with regard to this factor.") (internal quotations omitted).

B. The disclosure is "likely to contribute" to an understanding of government operations or activities (the informative value of the information to be disclosed).

The information requested will help provide the Requesters with crucial insight into the policies and decision-making processes of BOEMRE as they relate to managing the environmental effects of offshore oil and gas extraction, including oil spills, on fish, birds, marine mammals, and other wildlife. These documents are not currently in the public domain. Their release is not only "likely to contribute," but is in fact certain to contribute to better public understanding of BOEMRE's obligations as well as BOEMRE activities/operations regarding management of offshore oil and gas resources and the implementation of environmental laws and regulations. The information requested will contribute to an understanding of whether or not BOEMRE is fulfilling its obligations, as well as what information BOEMRE has in regard to oil and gas extraction activities' effect on wildlife, and what BOEMRE is doing in regard to better manage offshore oil and gas extraction in light of that information. The public is always well served

when it knows how government activities, particularly matters touching on legal and ethical questions, have been conducted. *See Judicial Watch*, 326 F.3d at 1314 ("[T]he American people have as much interest in knowing that key [agency] decisions are free from the taint of conflict of interest as they have in discovering that they are not.").

In McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci, 835 F.2d at 1286, the court made clear that "[FOIA] legislative history suggests that information [has more potential to contribute to public understanding] to the degree that the information is new and supports public oversight of agency operations...." In this instance, all the requested documents potentially provide new information about BOEMRE actions, especially regarding its actions in relation to safeguarding the Arctic environment from oil spills and other impacts of oil development. Moreover, the information will provide important oversight of BOEMRE activities by revealing what information BOEMRE has about the risks posed by the BP Liberty project. See Western Watersheds Project v. Brown, 318 F.Supp.2d 1036, 1040 (D. Idaho 2004) ("WWP asserted in its initial request that the information requested was either not readily available or never provided to the public, facts never contradicted by the BLM. Therefore, the Court finds that WWP adequately demonstrated that the information would contribute significantly to public understanding."); see also Community Legal Services v. HUD, 405 F.Supp.2d 553 (D. Pa. 2005) ("[T]he CLS request would likely shed light on information that is new to the interested public."). Finally, this request will also shed light on whether BOEMRE is appropriately implementing environmental laws and regulations.

C. The disclosure is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of government operations or activities.

Public understanding of the environmental effects of offshore oil and gas extraction on fish, birds, marine mammals, and other wildlife, as well as of BOEMRE activities in regard to management of the effects of oil and gas extraction, will significantly increase as a result of disclosure because the requested information will reveal more about actions being taken to safeguard the Arctic environment from the impacts of the BP Liberty project. In other words, once the public is more aware of BOEMRE's actions, the public: a) will have a better understanding of the status of the management of the BP Liberty project and affected wildlife, and b) can better gauge whether BOEMRE decisions and activities are appropriate or whether certain actions should be undertaken.

The documents are also certain to shed light on BOEMRE's compliance with environmental and natural resource laws. Such public oversight of agency action is vital to our democratic system and clearly envisioned by the drafters of the FOIA. The Requesters intend to fulfill their well established function of public oversight of agency action. The Requesters are not requesting these documents merely for their intrinsic informational value. It is irrelevant whether any portion of the request may currently be in the public domain, because the Requesters seek considerably more than any piece of information that may currently be available to other individuals. *Judicial Watch*, 326 F.3d at 1315.

In addition, the Requesters plan to take the information they learn from the disclosed documents and educate the public about the impacts of the BP Liberty project on affected fish, birds and

marine mammals in the Beaufort Sea, and also educate the public about whether BOEMRE's management and conservation strategies are appropriate in light of the known information. See Western Watersheds Project, 318 F.Supp.2d at1040 ("In the letter denying the appeal, the FOIA Officer stated that WWP had failed to demonstrate....how the information would contribute to the understanding of the general public of the operations or activities of the government. The Court, however...finds that WWP adequately specified the public interest to be served, that is, educating the public about the ecological conditions of the land managed by the BLM and...how management strategies employed by the BLM may adversely affect the environment.").

The requested information will reveal in greater detail what BOEMRE knows regarding the possible effects of the BP Liberty project on impacted fish, birds and marine mammals, as well as the lawfulness of BOEMRE's actions. There can be no dispute that disclosure of the requested documents may provide information that will significantly enhance the public's understanding of BOEMRE's legal obligations and BOEMRE wildlife management in general. Even if the documents fail to reveal that certain actions need to be taken, this does not mean the documents do not serve the public interest. *See Judicial Watch*, 326 F.3d at 1314.

II. Obtaining the information is of no commercial interest to the Requesters.

Access to government documents, disclosure forms, and similar materials through FOIA requests is essential to the Requesters' role of educating the general public. The Requesters, both non-profit organizations, have no commercial interest and will realize no commercial benefit from the release of the requested information.

III. The Requesters have a recognized ability to disseminate this information broadly.

The Requesters are non-profit organizations that inform, educate, and counsel the public regarding environmental issues, policies, and laws relating to environmental issues. The Requesters have been substantially involved in the management activities of numerous government agencies for years, and have consistently displayed their ability to disseminate information granted to it through FOIA.

In consistently granting the Requesters' fee-waiver requests, agencies have recognized that: (1) the requested information contributes significantly to the public understanding of the operations or activities of the government; (2) the requested information enhances the public's understanding to a greater degree than currently exists; (3) the Requesters possess the expertise to explain the requested information to the public; (4) the Requesters possess the ability to disseminate the requested information to the general public; and (5) the news media recognizes that the Requesters are established experts in the field of climate change, oil and gas impacts, imperiled species, and biodiversity.

Public oversight and enhanced understanding of BOEMRE duties is absolutely necessary. The Requesters' members' track record of active participation in oversight of governmental agency activities and their consistent contribution to the public's understanding of agency activities as compared to the level of public understanding prior to disclosure are well established. In

determining whether the disclosure of requested information will contribute significantly to public understanding, a guiding test is whether the requester will disseminate the disclosed records to a reasonably broad audience of persons interested in the subject. *Carney v U.S. Dept. of Justice*, 19 F.3d 807 (2nd Cir. 1994). The Requesters need not show how they intend to distribute the information, because "[n]othing in FOIA, the [agency] regulation, or our case law require[s] such pointless specificity." *Judicial Watch*, 326 F.3d at 1314. It is sufficient for the Requesters to show how they distribute information to the public generally. *Id*.

Concurrent with any action the Requesters may take after obtaining the requested documents, the Requesters will publicize the reasons for the action and the underlying actions of BOEMRE and/or other agencies that have prompted the action. This is certain to result in a significant increase in public understanding of government agency activity, and in particular of BOEMRE responsibilities. The Requesters have enforced or publicized agency compliance with the provisions of various environmental laws many times through information gained from FOIA requests like this one. The Requesters intend to use the documents requested in this request in a similar manner.

In addition, the Requesters' informational publications supply information not only to our membership, but also to the memberships of most other conservation organizations, locally as well as nationally. The Requesters' informational publications continue to contribute information to public media outlets as well. For example, information such as that presently requested is often disseminated through the Center's e-mail Biodiversity alerts, which are sent to nearly 90,000 people approximately once a week, and the Center's web page, which is accessed nearly 1.5 million times each month. Greenpeace websites, outreach and grassroots networks provide information to millions of people every month. Greenpeace produces factsheets, reports, information toolkits, email alerts and bulletins to disseminate information to its supporters, the general public, media outlets and other target audiences. Greenpeace campaigns internationally, meaning information and publications are translated and disseminated internationally as well.

Information concerning the BP Liberty project, BOEMRE's actions regarding that project, and BOEMRE's compliance with environmental laws will likely be disseminated through all of these means. *See Forest Guardians v. DOI*, 416 F.3d 1173, 1180 (10th Cir. 2005) ("Among other things, Forest Guardians publishes an online newsletter, which is e-mailed to more than 2,500 people, and stated that it intends to establish an interactive grazing web site with the information obtained from the BLM. By demonstrating that the records are meaningfully informative to the general public and how it will disseminate such information, Forest Guardians has shown that the requested information is likely to contribute to the public's understanding of the BLM's operations and activities.").

CONCLUSION

I hope that this letter has demonstrated to your satisfaction that the Requesters qualify for a full fee-waiver, and that you will immediately begin to search and copy the requested material. I urge you to act promptly on this request, because of the need for timely review of records to effectively participate in comment periods on impact statements and proposed permitting actions. Access to the requested records should be granted within twenty (20) working days from the date

of your receipt. Failure to respond in a timely manner shall be viewed as a denial of this request and we may immediately file an administrative appeal.

For any of the requested records which are commonly used, and easily copied, electronic formats (e.g., Word, emails, PDFs), please provide the records to us in that electronic format to save time and reduce costs. Please send all materials to the address on the letterhead. If some records are available sooner than others, please forward those rather than waiting for a search for other records.

Earthjustice, on behalf of Alaska Wilderness League, Audubon Alaska, Center for Biological Diversity, Natural Resources Defense Council, and World Wildlife Fund, submits this request for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552.

Documents Requested

In January 2010, Earthjustice submitted a FOIA request for documents relating to Shell Offshore Inc.'s Beaufort Sea Regional Exploration Oil Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan (Beaufort Spill Plan) and Shell Gulf of Mexico Inc.'s May 2009

Chukchi Sea Regional Exploration Oil Discharge and Contingency Plan Revision 0 (the Chukchi Spill Plan) (FOIA Request No. MMS-2010-00051). In March 2010, the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation, and Enforcement (BOEMRE) provided Earthjustice documents responsive to this request.

We now request copies of all documents, including memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, and electronic mail, which were generated, received, kept and/or considered since BOEMRE provided Earthjustice documents in response to FOIA Request No. MMS-2010-00051 in March 2010 that address the following matters:

- All documents relating to the Chukchi Spill Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any changes Shell proposed following the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, Shell's equipment inventory (30 C.F.R. § 254.24), the calculation of the "worst case discharge" (30 C.F.R. § 254.47), any consultation(s) BOEMRE conducted pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BOEMRE's environmental review of the proposed spill response techniques in the Chukchi Spill Plan (e.g., in situ burning, dispersant application, decanting, etc.) under the National Environmental Policy Act.
- All documents relating to the Beaufort Spill Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any changes Shell proposed following the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, Shell's equipment inventory (30 C.F.R. § 254.24), the calculation of the "worst case discharge" (30 C.F.R. § 254.47), any consultation(s) BOEMRE conducted pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BOEMRE's environmental review of the proposed spill response techniques in the Beaufort Spill Plan (e.g., in situ burning, decanting, etc.) under the National Environmental Policy Act.

This request does not include the documents BOEMRE previously provided Earthjustice nor does it include copies of the approved Spill Plans available via BOEMRE's website.

We expect BOEMRE's response will comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt, openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009). Accordingly, BOEMRE should apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so legally." *Id*.

Fee Waiver Requested

We request a waiver of any fees associated with this request. FOIA mandates that agencies waive or reduce search and copying fees where the disclosure is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

In addition to the statutory direction, the U.S. Department of the Interior (Interior) has issued regulations outlining four factors that it considers in deciding whether a fee waiver is warranted: (1) the request concerns the operations or activities of government; (2) the disclosure likely will contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities; (3) the disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding; and (4) the disclosure is not primarily in the requester's commercial interest. *See* 43 C.F.R. Part 2, App. D(b).

As one court explained, if a non-profit organization has "identified why they wanted the administrative record, what they intended to do with it, to whom they planned on distributing it, and the [relevant] expertise of their membership," then a waiver is appropriate. *Ctr. for Biological Diversity v. Office of Mgmt. & Budget*, 546 F. Supp. 2d 722, 727 (N.D. Cal. 2008) (internal quotation omitted). The information provided below demonstrates that the requesting groups meet the required criteria and is entitled to a full fee waiver.

1. The Request Concerns Government Operations and Activities.

This FOIA request seeks information regarding BOEMRE's operations and activities in carrying out the requirements of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA), which enhances the nation's ability to prevent and respond to oil spills. *See* 33 U.S.C. § 2701 *et seq.* To ensure that the owner or operator of an offshore facility is prepared to respond to an oil spill and to verify compliance with the mandates of OPA, BOEMRE requires owners and operators of offshore facilities to have an approved oil spill response plan. Accordingly, this FOIA request directly concerns the operations and activities of the government in requiring that legal standards regarding oil spill prevention and response are met.

2. Disclosure Will Contribute to Public Understanding of BOEMRE's Operations and Activities.

There is a direct connection between the requested records and BOEMRE's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean. The requested records relate to the government's evaluation of oil spill prevention and readiness in the Beaufort and Chukchi seas and management of public resources in the Arctic Ocean. Access to these records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate BOEMRE's analyses and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Consequently, the requested documents are critical to a meaningful assessment of the agency's actions and a thorough public understanding of the government's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean.

The requesters are public-interest organizations dedicated to protecting the environment, public resources, and human health by, among other mechanisms, monitoring government management of public lands, encouraging public participation in government processes, and ensuring enforcement of applicable public laws. We will scrutinize the scientific and legal underpinnings of the Spill Plans and these analyses will form the basis for responding to BOEMRE's actions and educating the public. *See Friends of the Coast Fork v. United States Dep't of the Interior*, 110 F.3d 53, 55 (9th Cir. 1997).

The requesting groups also intend to disseminate information that may be available in the requested records through various means, including newsletters, reports, newspaper and magazine articles, web sites, and through other formal and informal communications. These types of public outreach are sufficient to warrant a fee waiver. *See W. Watersheds Proj. v. Brown*, 318 F. Supp. 2d 1036, 1041 (D. Idaho 2004) (noting cases holding "statements of intent to disseminate requested information through newsletters, popular news outlets, and presentations to public interest requestors, government agencies, and the general public sufficient to entitle an organization to a fee waiver").

The requesting organizations possess the experience and expertise necessary to evaluate the requested information and provide it to the public in a useful form. *Cf. W. Watersheds Proj.*, 318 F. Supp. 2d at 1040-41. The groups are qualified to extract, synthesize, analyze, and convey the requested information to our supporters, other organizations, and the public at large in a way that will increase understanding of government actions affecting public resources in Alaska. The organizations have scientists, lawyers, and communications professionals who specialize in public outreach. They use that expertise to analyze and evaluate information about governmental decisions affecting public resources, such as the management of the outer

continental shelf, and provide our analyses and evaluations to our supporters, other organizations, and the general public.

These groups have a long history of evaluating information similar to that requested here and distributing it to help inform the public and encourage participation in future planning processes. They have been involved in various public processes involving the Alaska outer continental shelf.

3. The Disclosure Will Contribute Significantly to Public Understanding.

Issues involving oil spill response and prevention are of significant public interest. The requested disclosure will increase public understanding of BOEMRE's actions relating to the Arctic Ocean, and the Beaufort and Chukchi seas in particular. Although the Spill Plans are available to the public, other supporting documents are not. These records will provide recent information underlying the agency's decision-making, afford insight into the agency's decision-making processes, and highlight any competing viewpoints. These records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate the agency's decision-making and the adequacy of the analyses, facilitating public oversight of agency operations.

4. The Requesters Have No Commercial Interest in the Disclosure of the Information.

The requesting groups are nonprofit organizations that have no commercial interest in the requested records. *See McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (noting that FOIA's fee waiver provision is to be "'liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requestors'" (quoting legislative history)).

Documents responsive to your request have been located and will be forwarded to you by June 16, 2010 with the following exceptions:

- A small portion of 23 documents (24 pages) contain information protected by the Privacy Act and are being withheld under Exemption 6 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6)) which permits the withholding of information the release of which could constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
- Large portions of 76 documents (730 pages) contain advisory opinions, recommendations, deliberations, advice, and suggestions between subordinates and superiors on a proposed action which are part of the Agency's decision making process and are being withheld under Exemption 5 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(5)(b)(1)) which permits the withholding of Deliberative-Process Privilege information that is of a speculative, tentative, or evaluative nature that would impede the activities of the agency. Portions of these documents (619 pages) also contain geological and geophysical information concerning wells and are being withheld under Exemption 9 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(9)).
- Portions of 6 documents (6 pages) contain privileged and confidential communications between the agency attorney and his/her client relating to a legal matter for which the client has sought profession advice. This information is being withheld under Exemption 5 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(5)(b)(3)) Attorney/Client



Privilege which permits the withholding of facts divulged by a client to his/her attorney in confidence and opinions given by an attorney to his/her client based upon those facts.

- Twenty-four documents (97 pages) contain trade secrets, commercial or financial information obtained by BOEMRE that is considered privileged or confidential. Therefore, we are withholding the materials in their entirety under Exemption 4 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4)). These documents also contain geological and geophysical information concerning wells and are being withheld under Exemption 9 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(9)).
- Large portions of 9 documents (689 pages) contain trade secrets, commercial or financial information obtained by BOEMRE that is considered privileged or confidential. Therefore, we are withholding the under Exemption 4 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4)). Portions of these documents (673 pages) also contain geological and geophysical information concerning wells and are being withheld under Exemption 9 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(9)). Portions of these documents (5 pages) also contain advisory opinions, recommendations, deliberations, advice, and suggestions between subordinates and superiors on a proposed action which are part of the Agency's decision making process and are being withheld under Exemption 5 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(5)(b)(1)) which permits the withholding of Deliberative-Process Privilege information that is of a speculative, tentative, or evaluative nature that would impede the activities of the agency.

On behalf of Alaska Wilderness League, the Center for Biological Diversity, Earthjustice, Greenpeace, Natural Resources Defense Council, Ocean Conservancy, Pacific Environment, and World Wildlife Fund, we submit this request for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552.

On October 5, 2010, Shell Offshore Inc. submitted to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation, and Enforcement (BOEMRE): (i) an Application for Permit to Drill in 2011 (APD) under its 2010 Outer Continental Shelf Lease Exploration Plan for Camden Bay, Alaska (Exploration Plan); (ii) responses to the Notice to Lessees 2010-N06 (NTL 2010-N06); and (iii) updates to and a summary of the updates to its Exploration

Plan. On October 6, BOEMRE made available to the public portions of Shell's submissions on its Alaska Region website, specifically an October 5 cover letter from Shell to BOEMRE's Regional Supervisor Jeff Walker concerning the submissions and an attached summary of the updates to Shell's Exploration Plan. Shell's APD, its Exploration Plan updates, and its responses to NTL 2010-N06 were not made publically available.

We request copies of Shell's APD, its Exploration Plan updates, its responses to NTL 2010-N06 (and the associated executive summary), as well as all memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, electronic mail records, or other documents, which were generated, received, kept and/or considered by BOEMRE relating to Shell's APD, Exploration Plan updates, and responses to NTL 2010-N06. This request does not include Shell's October 5 letter, the summary of its Exploration Plan updates, or other information that is readily available on BOEMRE's website.

In its cover letter, Shell states that it "expects [BOEMRE] to keep confidential the APD and response to NTL 2010-N06." The basis for Shell's expectation is unclear. On its face, acceding to Shell's implied request would appear to conflict with Secretary Salazar's commitment, as stated May 29 when establishing BOEMRE, that the reorganization would enable for greater transparency. Notably, leaseholders' responses required by NTL 2010-N06 are intended to address issues related to the *Deepwater Horizon* disaster, such as recalculated blowout scenarios, enhanced safety measures, and specifics regarding potential relief wells. Review of the information produced by Shell is critical for evaluating the steps that have been taken by the government and industry in response to the Gulf spill. BOEMRE's apparent unwillingness to disclose Shell's submissions is simply incompatible with any approach that values public oversight.

At a minimum, withholding the APD is irreconcilable with governing regulations establishing that data and information submitted on MMS forms "will be made available to the public upon submission." 30 CFR § 250.197(a). The regulation delineates the specific information on the APD that may be appropriately withheld and provides no support for shielding the entirety from public review.

In addition, BOEMRE's response should comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt, openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009) (Attorney General Memorandum). Accordingly, we expect that BOEMRE will apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so

legally." *Id.*; see also 40 C.F.R. § 1506.6(f) (noting the intersection of the National Environmental Policy Act and FOIA). We also expect that BOEMRE will act promptly, in keeping with the Attorney General's admonition that the timely disclosure of information "is an essential component of transparency." Attorney General Memorandum at 3.

We also request a waiver of any fees associated with this request. FOIA mandates that agencies waive or reduce search and copying fees where the disclosure is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

In addition to this statutory direction, the U.S. Department of the Interior has issued regulations outlining four factors that it will consider in deciding whether a fee waiver is warranted: (1) that the request concerns the operations or activities of government; (2) that the disclosure will likely contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities; (3) that the disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding; and (4) that the disclosure is not primarily in the requesters' commercial interest. *See* 43 C.F.R. Part 2, App. D(b). The information provided below demonstrates that the requesters meet all above criteria and are entitled to a full fee waiver.

1. The request concerns the operations and activities of the government.

This FOIA request seeks information relevant to BOEMRE's management of public resources in the Arctic Ocean. The federal government has jurisdiction over all submerged lands on the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) seaward of state boundaries pursuant to the OCS Lands Act. 43 U.S.C. § 1331 *et seq*. Under the Act, the Department of the Interior is required to manage the leasing, exploration, development, and production of oil and gas resources on the federal OCS. *Id*. Among other requirements, the Act requires that OCS development proceed in a safe and efficient manner that provides for environmental protection. *E.g.*, 43 U.S.C. § 1334(a)(2)(A). At issue here, BOEMRE is considering approval of Shell's APD which will enable Shell to conduct an exploration drilling program on its OCS leases in the Beaufort Sea in 2011. The requested documents will enable requestors to evaluate the strength and basis for any analysis or decision-making done by the agency. Accordingly, the FOIA request directly concerns the operations and activities of the government in managing public resources in the Arctic.

2. The disclosure will likely contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities.

There is a direct connection between the requested records and BOEMRE's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean. Issues around offshore oil and gas development have been subject to public debate in recent years, particularly in the wake of the BP *Deepwater Horizon* disaster in the Gulf of Mexico. The requested records directly relate to Shell's proposed exploration drilling program for 2011 in the Beaufort Sea and will enable the requesters to evaluate the agency's analyses, decision-making processes, and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Consequently, the requested documents are critical for a meaningful assessment of the agency's actions and are necessary for a thorough public understanding of the government's operations and activities in the Alaskan Arctic Ocean.

The requesters have both the ability and intent to publicize information related to the requested records to the general public. The requesters are public-interest organizations, whose core missions involve protecting the environment, public resources, and human health by, among other mechanisms, monitoring government management of public lands, encouraging public participation in government processes, and ensuring enforcement of applicable public laws. The requested documents will undergo scientific and legal scrutiny by the requesters and these analyses will form the basis for responding to action by BOEMRE and educating the public. See Friends of the Coast Fork v. United States Dep't of the Interior, 110 F.3d 53, 55 (9th Cir. 1997). The requesters intend to disseminate information that may be available in the requested records through various means, including newsletters, reports, newspaper and magazine articles, the organizations' web sites, and through other formal and informal communications. These types of public outreach have been found to be sufficient to warrant a fee waiver. See W. Watersheds Proj. v. Brown, 318 F. Supp. 2d 1036, 1041 (D. Idaho 2004) (noting cases holding that "statements of intent to disseminate requested information through newsletters, popular news outlets, and presentations to public interest requestors, government agencies, and the general public sufficient to entitle an organization to a fee waiver").

The requesters possess the experience and expertise necessary to evaluate the requested information and provide it to the public in a useful form. *Cf. W. Watersheds Proj.*, 318 F. Supp. 2d at 1040-41. The requesters are highly qualified to extract, synthesize, analyze, and convey the requested information to their members, other organizations, and the public at large in a way that will significantly increase their understanding of government actions affecting public resources in Alaska. The requesters' staffs include scientists, lawyers, and professionals who specialize in public

outreach. The requesters use that expertise to analyze and evaluate information about governmental decisions affecting public resources, such as the management of the OCS, and provide their analyses and evaluations to members and the general public. Moreover, issues involving domestic oil exploration are of significant public interest.

The requesters have a long history of evaluating information similar to that requested here and distributing it to help inform the public and encourage participation in future planning processes. They have been involved in various public processes involving the Alaskan OCS, including submitting comments on Shell's proposed Beaufort Sea Exploration Plan.

3. The disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding.

The requested disclosure will significantly increase public understanding of BOEMRE's actions relating to the Arctic, and its approval of the Shell Beaufort exploration drilling program in particular. These records will provide recent information that will inform the agency's decision-making, afford insight into the agency's decision-making processes, and highlight any competing viewpoints. These records will allow the requesters to evaluate the agency's decision-making and the adequacy of the analyses, facilitating public oversight of agency operations.

4. The requesters have no commercial interest in the disclosure of the information.

The requesters are nonprofit organizations that have no commercial interest in the requested records. *See McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (noting that FOIA's fee waiver provision is to be "'liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requestors'" (quoting legislative history)).

On May 12, 2011, BOEMRE received from Shell Gulf of Mexico Inc. its Revised Oil Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan (the Chukchi Spill Plan) in support of a proposed exploration drilling program in the Chukchi Sea.

We now request copies of all documents, including memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, and electronic mail, which were generated, received, kept and/or considered since Earthjustice sent BOEMRE FOIA Request No. MMS-2011-00129 on April 20, 2011 that address the following matters:

- All documents relating to the Chukchi Spill Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any changes proposed following the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, the equipment inventory (30 C.F.R. § 254.24), the calculation of the "worst case discharge" (30 C.F.R. § 254.47), any consultation(s) BOEMRE conducted pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BOEMRE's environmental review of the proposed spill response techniques in the Chukchi Spill Plan (e.g., in situ burning, dispersant application, decanting, etc.) under the National Environmental Policy Act; and,
- All documents relating to the Beaufort Spill Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any changes proposed following the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, the equipment inventory (30 C.F.R. § 254.24), the calculation of the "worst case discharge" (30 C.F.R. § 254.47), any consultation(s) BOEMRE conducted pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BOEMRE's environmental review of the proposed spill response techniques in the Beaufort Spill Plan (e.g., in situ burning, decanting, etc.) under the National Environmental Policy Act.

We expect BOEMRE's response will comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt,

openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009). Accordingly, BOEMRE should apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so legally." *Id*.

Fee Waiver Requested

This request does not include the documents covered by FOIA Request No. MMS-2011-00164, rather it addresses only those documents generated, received, kept and/or considered since May 31, 2011. It also does not include copies of the Chukchi Spill Plan available on BSEE's website.

We expect BSEE's response will comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt, openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009). Accordingly, BSEE should apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so legally." *Id*.

Fee Waiver Requested

We request a waiver of any fees associated with this request. FOIA mandates that agencies waive or reduce search and copying fees where the disclosure is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

United States Dep't of the Interior*, 110 F.3d 53, 55 (9th Cir. 1997).

The requesting groups also intend to disseminate information that may be available in the requested records through various means, including newsletters, reports, newspaper and magazine articles, web sites, and through other formal and informal communications. These types of public outreach are sufficient to warrant a fee waiver. *See W. Watersheds Proj. v. Brown*, 318 F. Supp. 2d 1036, 1041 (D. Idaho 2004) (noting cases holding "statements of intent to disseminate requested information through newsletters, popular news outlets, and presentations to public interest requestors, government agencies, and the general public sufficient to entitle an organization to a fee waiver").

The requesting organizations possess the experience and expertise necessary to evaluate the requested information and provide it to the public in a useful form. *Cf. W. Watersheds Proj.*, 318 F. Supp. 2d at 1040-41. These groups have a long history of evaluating information similar to that requested here and distributing it to help inform the public and encourage participation in future planning processes. They have been involved in various public processes involving the Alaska outer continental shelf.

3. The Disclosure Will Contribute Significantly to Public Understanding.

Issues involving oil spill response and prevention are of significant public interest. The requested disclosure will increase public understanding of BSEE's actions relating to the Arctic Ocean, and the Chukchi Sea in particular. Although the Chukchi Spill Plan is available to the public, other supporting documents are not. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (noting that FOIA's fee waiver provision is to be "'liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requestors" (quoting legislative history)).

In addition to the statutory direction, the U.S. Department of the Interior (Interior) has issued regulations outlining four factors that it considers in deciding whether a fee waiver is warranted: (1) the request concerns the operations or activities of government; (2) the disclosure likely will contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities; (3) the disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding; and (4) the disclosure is not primarily in the requester's commercial interest. *See* 43 C.F.R. Part 2, App. D(b).

As one court explained, if a non-profit organization has "identified why they wanted the administrative record, what they intended to do with it, to whom they planned on distributing it, and the [relevant] expertise of their membership," then a waiver is appropriate. *Ctr. for Biological Diversity v. Office of Mgmt. & Budget*, 546 F. Supp. 2d 722, 727 (N.D. Cal. 2008) (internal quotation omitted). The information provided below demonstrates that the requesting groups meet the required criteria and is entitled to a full fee waiver.

1. The Request Concerns Government Operations and Activities.

This FOIA request seeks information regarding BSEE's operations and activities in carrying out the requirements of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA), which enhances the nation's ability to prevent and respond to oil spills. *See* 33 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq. To ensure that the owner or operator of an offshore facility is prepared to respond to an oil spill and to verify compliance with the mandates of OPA, BSEE requires owners and operators of offshore facilities to have an approved oil spill response plan. Accordingly, this FOIA request directly concerns the

operations and activities of the government in requiring that legal standards regarding oil spill prevention and response are met.

2. Disclosure Will Contribute to Public Understanding of BSEE's Operations and Activities.

There is a direct connection between the requested records and BSEE's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean. The requested records relate to the government's evaluation of oil spill prevention and readiness in the Chukchi Sea and management of public resources in the Arctic Ocean. Access to these records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate BSEE's analyses and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Consequently, the requested documents are critical to a meaningful assessment of the agency's actions and a thorough public understanding of the government's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean.

The requesters are public-interest organizations dedicated to protecting the environment, public resources, and human health by, among other mechanisms, monitoring government management of public lands, encouraging public participation in government processes, and ensuring enforcement of applicable public laws. We will scrutinize the scientific and legal underpinnings of the Chukchi Spill Plan and these analyses will form the basis for responding to BSEE's actions and educating the public. *See Friends of the Coast Fork v. United States Dep't of the Interior*, 110 F.3d 53, 55 (9th Cir. 1997).

The requesting groups also intend to disseminate information that may be available in the requested records through various means, including newsletters, reports, newspaper and magazine articles, web sites, and through other formal and informal communications. These types of public outreach are sufficient to warrant a fee waiver. *See W. Watersheds Proj. v. Brown*, 318 F. Supp. 2d 1036, 1041 (D. Idaho 2004) (noting cases holding "statements of intent to disseminate requested information through newsletters, popular news outlets, and presentations to public interest requestors, government agencies, and the general public sufficient to entitle an organization to a fee waiver").

The requesting organizations possess the experience and expertise necessary to evaluate the requested information and provide it to the public in a useful form. *Cf. W. Watersheds Proj.*, 318 F. Supp. 2d at 1040-41. The groups are qualified to extract, synthesize, analyze, and convey the requested information to our supporters, other organizations, and the public at large in a way that will increase understanding of government actions affecting public resources in Alaska. The organizations have scientists, lawyers, and communications professionals who specialize in public outreach. They use that expertise to analyze and evaluate information about governmental decisions affecting public resources, such as the management of the outer

continental shelf, and provide our analyses and evaluations to our supporters, other organizations, and the general public.

These groups have a long history of evaluating information similar to that requested here and distributing it to help inform the public and encourage participation in future planning processes. They have been involved in various public processes involving the Alaska outer continental shelf.

3. The Disclosure Will Contribute Significantly to Public Understanding.

Issues involving oil spill response and prevention are of significant public interest. The requested disclosure will increase public understanding of BSEE's actions relating to the Arctic Ocean, and the Chukchi Sea in particular. Although the Chukchi Spill Plan is available to the public, other supporting documents are not. These records will provide recent information underlying the agency's decision-making, afford insight into the agency's decision-making processes, and highlight any competing viewpoints. These records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate the agency's decision-making and the adequacy of the analyses, facilitating public oversight of agency operations.

4. The Requesters Have No Commercial Interest in the Disclosure of the Information.

The requesting groups are nonprofit organizations that have no commercial interest in the requested records. *See McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (noting that FOIA's fee waiver provision is to be "'liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requestors" (quoting legislative history)).

- ➤ Publication in PEER's newsletter that has a circulation of approximately 20,000, including 1,500 environmental journalists.

Through these methods, PEER generates an average of 1.5 mainstream news articles per day. Moreover, PEER has demonstrated the ability to generate nationwide news coverage concerning related BSEE activities.

4. Disclosure would not serve a commercial interest of the requestor.

Disclosure is in no way connected with any commercial interest of the requestors in that PEER is a nonprofit, nonpartisan public interest organization concerned with upholding the public trust through responsible management of our nation's resources and with supporting professional integrity within public land management and pollution control agencies. To that end, PEER is designated as a tax-exempt organization under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue code.

Earthjustice, on behalf of Alaska Wilderness League, Audubon Alaska, Center for Biological Diversity, and Natural Resources Defense Council, submits this request for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552. This request supplements our May 8, 2012, FOIA request (MMS-2012-00166, MMS-2012-00163) and our July 31, 2012, FOIA request BSEE-2012-00212, BSEE-2012-00213).

Documents Requested

• On May 8, 2012, we submitted a FOIA request to the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement (BSEE) for documents related to ten applications for permits to drill (APD) wells in the Beaufort and Chukchi seas submitted by Shell Offshore Inc. and Shell Gulf of Mexico Inc. (collectively Shell). BSEE Alaska Region acknowledged receipt of our request on May 10, 2012, and assigned it the reference number: MMS-2012-0166. On October 15, 2012, BSEE Alaska Region indicated by letter that while it had located documents responsive to our request, there would be "a delay in processing" the request due to "overall workload and the large backlog of FOIA

requests." BSEE Headquarters acknowledged receipt of our request on May 24, 2012, assigned it the reference number: MMS-2012-00163, and indicated that there would be a delay in processing our request "due to the large backlog of FOIA requests received by this office." As of the date of this letter, neither BSEE Alaska Region nor BSEE Headquarters has provided responsive documents.

• On July 31, 2012, we submitted a FOIA request to BSEE for documents related to ConocoPhillips Company's (ConocoPhillips) regional exploration oil discharge prevention and contingency plan (Chukchi Spill Plan) for proposed exploration drilling in the Chukchi Sea. BSEE Alaska Region acknowledged receipt of our request on August 10, 2012, and assigned it the reference number: BSEE-2012-00212. On October 15, 2012, BSEE Alaska Region indicated by letter that while it had located documents responsive to our request, there would be "a delay in processing" the request due to "overall workload and the large backlog of FOIA requests." BSEE Headquarters acknowledged receipt of our request on August 27, 2012, assigned it the reference number: BSEE-2012-00213, and indicated there would be a delay in processing our request "due to the large backlog of FOIA requests received by this office." As of the date of this letter, neither BSEE Alaska Region nor BSEE Headquarters has provided responsive documents.

The correspondence related to these prior requests is attached to this letter for your information.

We now request that BSEE (i) provide us expeditiously with responses—already overdue—to our prior requests and (ii) additionally supplement our prior requests, which should include copies of all documents, including memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, and electronic messages, which were generated, received, kept and/or considered that address the following matters and are not covered by our prior requests (*e.g.*, because the materials were created after the receipt of those requests):

- All documents relating to Shell's ten APDs in the Beaufort and Chukchi seas;
- All documents relating to ConocoPhillips's submission of its proposed Chukchi Spill
 Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any consultation(s) BSEE is
 conducting pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BSEE's environmental review
 of the Chukchi Spill Plan under the National Environmental Policy Act; and
- All documents relating to the review or input by the Arctic Working Group, the
 interagency working group created by President Obama by Executive Order 13580 on
 July 12, 2011, regarding Shell's APDs and ConocoPhillips's Chukchi Spill Plan, including
 documents generated by, sent from, and/or received by any member of the Working
 Group (as that term is defined in Executive Order 13580), including deputy level
 representatives and any other representative or staff member from the respective agency
 or office, Shell, ConocoPhillips, and BSEE.

We expect BSEE's response will comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt, openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009). Accordingly, BSEE should apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so legally." *Id*.

Fee Waiver Requested

We request a waiver of any fees associated with this request. FOIA mandates that agencies waive or reduce search and copying fees where the disclosure is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

In addition to the statutory direction, the U.S. Department of the Interior (Interior) has issued regulations outlining four factors that it considers in deciding whether a fee waiver is warranted: (1) the request concerns the operations or activities of government; (2) the disclosure likely will contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities; (3) the disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding; and (4) the disclosure is not primarily in the requester's commercial interest. *See* 43 C.F.R. Part 2, App. D(b).

Earthjustice, on behalf of Alaska Wilderness League, Audubon Alaska, Center for Biological Diversity, and Natural Resources Defense Council, submits this request for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552.

Documents Requested

In February 2012, ConocoPhillips Company (ConocoPhillips) submitted to the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement (BSEE) a proposed regional exploration oil discharge prevention and contingency plan (Chukchi Spill Plan) for proposed exploration drilling in the Chukchi Sea, Alaska. As of July 2012, BSEE has not made the Chukchi Spill Plan available to the public.

On July 12, 2011, President Obama issued an executive order to establish an interagency working group to coordinate the efforts of Federal agencies responsible for overseeing the development of onshore and offshore energy resources and associated infrastructure in Alaska (Arctic Working Group) (Executive Order 13580).

We request copies of all memoranda, studies, reports, data, correspondence, comments, conversation records, files, electronic mail records, or other documents, which were generated, received, kept and/or considered that address the following matters:

- All documents relating to the Chukchi Spill Plan (or revisions thereto) including, but not limited to, any consultation(s) BSEE is conducting pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and BSEE's environmental review of the Chukchi Spill Plan under the National Environmental Policy Act; and
- All documents relating to the Arctic Working Group's review or input regarding
 the Chukchi Spill Plan, including documents generated and/or received from any
 member of the Working Group (as that term is defined in Executive Order
 13580), including deputy level representatives and any other representative or
 staff member from the respective agency or office.

This request includes all documents sent to and/or received from ConocoPhillips, BSEE, and/or all agencies, bureaus or governmental entities or representatives involved in the Working Group.

We expect BSEE's response will comply with the Attorney General's March 2009 memorandum, reiterating President Obama's directive that in "the face of doubt, openness prevails." Attorney General, Memorandum for Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies at 1 (March 19, 2009). Accordingly, BSEE should apply a presumption in favor of disclosure and consider that it "should not withhold information simply because it may do so legally." *Id*.

Fee Waiver Requested

We request a waiver of any fees associated with this request. FOIA mandates that agencies waive or reduce search and copying fees where the disclosure is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii).

In addition to the statutory direction, the U.S. Department of the Interior (Interior) has issued regulations outlining four factors that it considers in deciding whether a fee waiver is warranted: (1) the request concerns the operations or activities of government; (2) the disclosure likely will contribute to public understanding of government operations or activities; (3) the disclosure will contribute significantly to the public understanding; and (4) the disclosure is not primarily in the requester's commercial interest. *See* 43 C.F.R. Part 2, App. D(b).

As one court explained, if a non-profit organization has "identified why they wanted the administrative record, what they intended to do with it, to whom they planned on distributing it, and the [relevant] expertise of their membership," then a waiver is appropriate. *Ctr. for Biological Diversity v. Office of Mgmt. & Budget*, 546 F. Supp. 2d 722, 727 (N.D. Cal. 2008) (internal quotation omitted). The information provided below demonstrates that the requesting groups meet the required criteria and are entitled to a full fee waiver.

I. The Request Concerns Government Operations and Activities.

This FOIA request seeks information regarding BSEE's operations and activities in carrying out the requirements of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA), which enhances the nation's ability to prevent and respond to oil spills. See 33 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq. To ensure that the owner or operator of an offshore facility is prepared to respond to an oil spill and to verify compliance with the mandates of OPA, BSEE requires owners and operators of offshore facilities to have an approved oil spill response plan. Accordingly, this FOIA request directly concerns the operations and activities of the government in requiring that legal standards regarding oil spill prevention and response are met.

II. The Disclosure Will Likely Contribute to Public Understanding of BSEE's Operations and Activities.

There is a direct connection between the requested records and BSEE's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean. The requested records relate to the government's evaluation of oil spill prevention and readiness in the Chukchi Sea and management of public resources in the Arctic Ocean. Access to these records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate BSEE's analyses and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Consequently, the requested documents are critical to a meaningful assessment of the agency's actions and a thorough public understanding of the government's operations and activities in the Arctic Ocean.

The requesters are public-interest organizations dedicated to protecting the environment, public resources, and human health by, among other mechanisms, monitoring government management of public lands, encouraging public participation in government processes, and ensuring enforcement of applicable public laws. The requesters will scrutinize the scientific and legal underpinnings of the requested documents and these analyses will form the basis for responding to BSEE's actions and educating the public. *See Friends of the Coast Fork v. United States Dep't of the Interior*, 110 F.3d 53, 55 (9th Cir. 1997).

The requesting groups also intend to disseminate information that may be available in the requested records through various means, including newsletters, reports, newspaper and magazine articles, web sites, and through other formal and informal communications. These types of public outreach are sufficient to warrant a fee waiver. *See W. Watersheds Proj. v. Brown*, 318 F. Supp. 2d 1036, 1041 (D. Idaho 2004) (noting cases holding "statements of intent to disseminate requested information through newsletters, popular news outlets, and presentations to public interest groups, government agencies, and the general public sufficient to entitle an organization to a fee waiver").

The requesting organizations possess the experience and expertise necessary to evaluate the requested information and provide it to the public in a useful form. *Cf. W. Watersheds Proj.*, 318 F. Supp. 2d at 1040-41. The groups are qualified to extract, synthesize, analyze, and convey the requested information to our supporters, other organizations, and the public at large in a way that will increase understanding of government actions affecting public resources in Alaska. The organizations have scientists, lawyers, and communications professionals who specialize in public outreach. They use that expertise to analyze and evaluate information about governmental decisions affecting public resources, such as the management of the OCS, and provide our analyses and evaluations to our supporters, other organizations, and the general public.

These groups have a long history of evaluating information similar to that requested here and distributing it to help inform the public and encourage participation in future planning processes. They have been involved in various public processes involving the Alaska OCS.

III. The Disclosure Will Contribute Significantly to the Public Understanding.

Issues involving oil spill response and prevention are of significant public interest. The requested disclosure will increase public understanding of BSEE's actions relating to the Arctic Ocean, and the Chukchi Sea in particular. These records will provide recent information underlying the agency's decision-making, afford insight into the agency's decision-making processes, and highlight any competing viewpoints. These records will allow the requesting groups to evaluate the agency's decision-making and the adequacy of the analyses, facilitating public oversight of agency operations.

IV. The Requesters Have No Commercial Interest in the Disclosure of the Information.

The requesting groups are nonprofit organizations that have no commercial interest in the requested records. *See McClellan Ecological Seepage Situation v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1284 (9th Cir. 1987) (noting that FOIA's fee waiver provision is to be "'liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requestors'" (quoting legislative history)).


